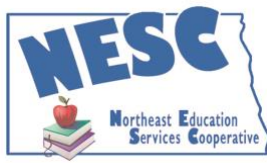
Grants/Professional Learning

US Department of Education Native Youth Community Project (NYCP)

The NESC was recently notified of the grant award for a five-year project with the goals to increase college and career readiness for secondary students and increase awareness of and pathways to the teaching profession. The focus is on Minnewaukan High School with additional partnerships between the University of Jamestown as well as the Spirit Lake Tribe and Devils Lake Public Schools. Jean Callahan shared out impacts of the program to-date.

NDREA – DPI High Impact Tutor Training Grant

Last fall, DPI offered a grant to the REAs for training of paraprofessionals and/or tutors statewide. The NESC and SEEC were approved to provide the plan and administration for this project, which will provide the option for schools to participate in Master Teacher PD (online platform with 150+ courses; annual subscription paid directly by NESC), or in



Safe and Civil Schools PD, such as Assisting the Teacher workshops. Schools are encouraged to get staff members registered for the August 21 Safe and Civil Schools *Assisting the Teacher* workshop soon (registrations are limited). Information is on pages 15-16 of the board packet.

ND DPI Family Engagement Grant

Planning for School, Family and Community Partnerships is a workshop series for leadership teams (Joyce Epstein framework for family engagement / Johns Hopkins University). Erin Lacina and Cortney Shuley from the NESC are Certified Trainers in the Epstein model of family engagement. Several cohorts are in progress this year, including two NESC member districts (Four Winds and Oberon). The plan is for more PD cohorts to be available next year.

DPI NDSS Grant

The NESC, SEEC and CREA were awarded a collaborative grant from DPI to support schools' implementation of the ND Content Standards through September of 2024. ND Standards-Based Learning frameworks, resources, and professional learning are in development with more to be available to schools during the 2023-24 school year. Grade K-12 proficiency scales for Science, Social Studies, and Health were developed by state workgroups in June 2022. Pages 20-21 includes additional information.

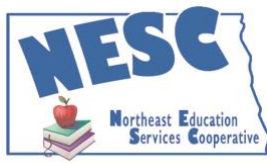
NDSS Professional Learning: There is a Marzano led workshop being planned for June 7-8, 2023 with the focus on using proficiency scales in the classroom. Student Activities

21st CCLC Grant

The NESCS 21st CCLC program is planning to participate in the Afterschool Day on the Hill in Bismarck on February 22 featuring our ConnectEd program available statewide.

Technology Learning Cooperative

The 2022-2023 full rotation is included in the board packet on page 42. As mentioned earlier in the meeting, we are working with DLPS to take over the TLC rotation next year. We'll be adjusting the rotation to move equipment four times over the year, following the quarters already common to districts. Some equipment will remain at schools for half the year.

Scrubs Camp: The NESCS was awarded the Scrubs Camp grant from UND Rural Health to host a two-day health careers camp on March 30 & 31, 2023 at LRSC. To date, 463 fifth graders are slated to attend.

ITV: There is one high school ITV class being offered this year between NESCS schools (DL and Starkweather). Langdon receives two classes outside of the NESCS, and LRSC has one dual credit ITV class going to Edmore. Dan Driessen from LRSC reported that classes have nearly all moved over to online formats. We will also hire out consulting to help support tech for ITV next year.

ConnectEd is available live each Tuesday at 3:45 p.m. Lessons (lesson plans, resources, and videos) are archived on the ConnectEd website (engineering, arts, college/career readiness, and ND State Historic Site virtual field trips). ConnectEd is supported through grants from the ND Afterschool Network Million Girls Moonshot Grant and the ND Council on the Arts. Building Tomorrow's Leaders (BTL) is being offered again in February with a joint partnership through DPI and NDSU Extension. There are three high schools participating in this project statewide. BTL Jr. is also being offered, with two NESCS schools (Devils Lake CMS and New Rockford-Sheyenne middle school student groups) participating.
